

¹As [Jesus] passed by, he saw a man blind from birth. ²And his disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" ³Jesus answered, "It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be displayed in him. ⁴We must work the works of him who sent me while it is day; night is coming, when no one can work. ⁵As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." ⁶Having said these things, he spat on the ground and made mud with the saliva. Then he anointed the man's eyes with the mud ⁷and said to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which means Sent). So he went and washed and came back seeing.



COVID-19 Update 3/17/2020

Lent Midweek and Sunday Worship Services Cancelled

Dear Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Every day we hear new announcements about the spread of the coronavirus world-wide. It's enough to cause a person to feel fear and panic. Isaiah 41:10 says, "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God, I will strengthen you and help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." Know the Lord is with you. The Lord's righteous right hand is the Lord Jesus, Himself. He will strengthen you. He will help you. He will uphold you. He has promised and He will do it.

On March 16th the President of the United States announced new limits on all gatherings in the U.S. to 10 people for the next 15 days. This announcement follows other Center for Disease Control guidelines that large gatherings and mass events be cancelled. Therefore, TLO is cancelling the following activities until further notice:

- Sunday morning Worship, Bible study and Sunday School cancelled
- Lenten Midweek Worship Services and Soup Suppers cancelled
- After school Confirmation classes onsite cancelled
- Pastoral visitation of shut-ins and the hospitalized Suspended until further notice, except for when near death or for critical pastoral care; Please call the church office to request a visit
- Beginning Wed., March 18, all activities involving 10 or more people cancelled. Activities
 involving 9 or fewer people can continue to meet at their discretion and should follow the social
 distancing guidelines.
- TLO School's K-4 musical scheduled for March 18 and 19 is postponed.
- Please stay home. Do your research and know the symptoms of COVID-19. If you are sick, experiencing runny nose, sore throat, dry cough, fever, difficulty breathing (contact your doctor)

Even though we will not be worshiping together, there are ways we can stay connected and remain faithful in Word, joyful in fellowship, and gifted to serve. Here are some ways for you to worship.

- In place of worship we are working on providing online streaming or recorded messages. More information will be communicated as it becomes available.
- The church office will remain open. Office hours will be 10am 2 pm.

- Many congregations livestream their services. Go online and search "LCMS Live Streaming Congregations"
- Worship Anew services are available on Direct TV each Sunday at 10:30 am.
- Register for Worship Anew DVDs from TLO. If you are interested in Worship Anew DVDs from the church please call us and these can be picked up at the church office or will be delivered to you.
- Worship Anew is also available for video streaming on your device. Search for Worship Anew. The program's website is www.worshipanew.org

- It is our hope that we will be able to hold worship at TLO on Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter.
- Your gifts and offerings will be vitally important during this time when we will not be worshiping together. There will still be staff salaries, mission funding, utilities, mortgage and other expenses.
