*CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

P O God of grace, you have imputed my sin to Jesus, and have imputed his righteousness to my life, clothing me with a bridegroom's robe. But in my Christian walk I am still in rags; my best prayers are stained with sin; my penitential tears are so much impurity; my confession of sin is so much self-deception; my receiving the Spirit is tainted with selfishness.

C **I need to repent of my repentance for I have no robe to bring to cover my sin, no loom to weave my own righteousness; I am always standing clothed in sin-stained garments, and by grace am always receiving a change of clothes, for you justify the ungodly.
Lord, have mercy! Christ have mercy! Lord, have mercy!**

P Believe the Good News! By grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. EPISTLE

Philippians 3:3–11

³For we are the real circumcision, who worship by the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh— ⁴though I myself have reason for confidence in the flesh also. If anyone else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more: ⁵circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; ⁶as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness, under the law blameless. ⁷But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. ⁸Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ ⁹and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith— ¹⁰that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, ¹¹that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead.
