AS WE GATHER

In this *Places of the Passion* service for Easter Sunday, we marvel with the women at the garden tomb—now empty—and hear the good news from the angel: "He has risen, just as he said." All fear is gone because Jesus is alive and all faith is found in his words of comfort and peace.

- Hear the good news! Jesus went to places of rejection, suffering, torment and death—for you. Jesus was determined to go to Gethsemane, Gabbatha and Golgotha—for you. And Jesus lives for you! That's why Jesus forgives you completely and loves you eternally. Faithful Lord, with me abide!
- I shall follow where you guide!


