AS WE GATHER

This Sunday we begin a new Summer Sermon Series, A Season of Psalms, beginning with Psalm 30, under the theme "Joy Comes in the Morning." The Lutheran Study Bible introduces Psalm 30: "In 2 Samuel and 1 Chronicles 21, David took a census of all men capable of fighting, indicating a reliance on human power over God's strength. As a consequence for this rebellion, a plague came on Israel, and 70,000 men died. In repentance, David bought land, built an altar, and offered a sacrifice to the Lord. This psalm was likely written to dedicate this land, the place where God's temple would later be built" (Lutheran Study Bible, CPH, p. 871).In this Psalm David confesses his sinful confidence in his wealth and God changes David's attitude from fear and sorrow to joy, praise and thanksgiving.

*CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- P We are tempted by the devil, the world and our own sinful desires and we fall into sin. Our guilt leads us to say with David, "O LORD, how many are my foes! Many are saying of my soul, there is no salvation for him in God." There is salvation with God, and we confess our sins to him, asking his forgiveness.
- C Almighty Lord, we turn away from your will and Word and follow the evil around us and within us. We are sorry for our sins. Forgive us, lift us out of our sin and guilt and shield us from temptation. With David we pray in hope, "You, O LORD, are a shield about me, my glory, and the lifter of my head."
- P "I cried aloud to the LORD, and he answered me from his holy hill." God answered our prayer from a holy hill called Golgotha. There Jesus Christ was nailed to the cross, suffering the punishment we deserved for our sins. For the sake of Jesus and by his command, I announce to you that your sins are forgiven, in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.




