

- P In today's second lesson Paul writes, "For no one can lay any foundation other than the one already laid, which is Jesus Christ." Jesus is the foundation of forgiveness, the doorway to deliverance and the gateway to glory. Because of his shed blood, death on the cross and empty tomb, all your sins are forgiven, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. And so we say with great joy, Christ is our Cornerstone.

Even I and my father's house have sinned. <sup>7</sup>We have acted very corruptly against you and have not kept the commandments, the statutes, and the rules that you commanded your servant Moses. <sup>8</sup>Remember the word that you commanded your servant Moses, saying, 'If you are unfaithful, I will scatter you among the peoples, <sup>9</sup>but if you return to me and keep my commandments and do them, though your dispersed be under the farthest skies, I will gather them from there and bring them to the place that I have chosen, to make my name dwell there.' <sup>10</sup>They are your servants and your people, whom you have redeemed by your great power and by your strong hand. <sup>11</sup>O Lord, let your ear be attentive to the prayer of your servant today, and grant him mercy in the sight of this man."


