



"But I had hoped." These are four of the saddest words in the English language. Micah knows—but he also knows about a hope that never fails. His name? Jesus!





*INVOCATION AND CALL TO WORSHIP






Every One His Witness Study Group Starts January 10, 2021 | 9:15am | TLO Gym
