AS WE GATHER

We continue our pursuit to know God more deeply and intimately. The topic? God's omnipresence—he is with us **always**!

- P In today's second reading St. Paul asks, "What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase?" Too often, merciful Father, I say "yes" and I go on sinning.
- C Dismissing these truths—
- P That all who are baptized into Christ Jesus are baptized into his death.
- C That my old self is crucified with Christ.
- P That my body of sin might be done away with.
- C That I should no longer be a slave to sin.
- P But a slave to sin, I am.
- C In my thinking, in my speaking and in my doing.
- C God be merciful to me, a poor sinful being.

Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.

- P I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God to you. And in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive all your sins, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- P Come, let us know.
- C Let us press on to know the LORD!

Romans 6:1–11

Genesis 35.1–7

¹What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? ²By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

⁵For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. ⁷For one who has died has been set free from sin. ⁸Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. ¹⁰For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. ¹¹So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.
