TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

AS WE GATHER

Every year on November 1 or the first Sunday of November, we pause our busy lives to remember the saints. Why remember the saints? To thank God for their life and witness, to be encouraged in our walk of faith, and to remember and rejoice for God giving us examples of how grace and faith look in the real lives of people we knew.
