AS WE GATHER

This day of days, this feast of feasts, is the climax of our Lenten meditations on "The Hand of the Lord." 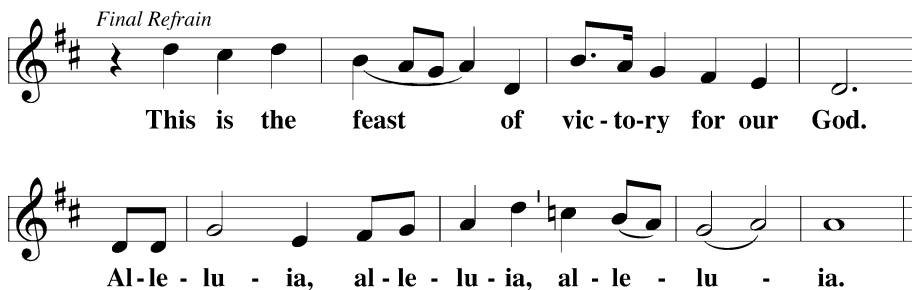
