FIRST READING

Acts 2:1–24

¹When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. ²And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. ⁴And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.

⁵Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. ⁶And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. ⁷And they were amazed and astonished, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans?" ⁸And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? ⁹Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, ¹¹both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians—we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." ¹²And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" ¹³But others mocking said, "They are filled with new wine."

Young Investors at TLO School

The Y.I. Stamp program of the Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF) provides students at TLO the opportunity to help God's kingdom to grow through their investment dollars. Each week of the school year Young Investors have the opportunity to save money in their Y.I. Steward accounts. This school year, 71 TLO students participated in the Y.I. Club, saving a combined total of \$8783 in their LCEF accounts! In addition to earning a premium interest rate (2.0%) on their Y.I. Steward accounts, participants also learn to be good stewards of their time and talents, with the opportunity to earn bonus dollars for good grades and for service hours. Through the Y.I. Stamp program TLO students grow as Christian stewards. Children do not need to be a member of TLO School to participate in this program, and grandparents can help grandchildren save.
