AS WE GATHER

The season of Lent lasts for forty days (excluding Sundays). During the Sundays in Lent we will consider what honest repentance looks like in our daily lives. Today's Old Testament reading from Genesis 1 encourages us to think of God's law not as a heavy burden, but as a set of boundaries that open up space for life in Christ Jesus to flourish. In our Sunday worship services during Lent, we will remember where we are going. We are headed toward the cross and empty tomb of Jesus. We are headed toward the celebration of Jesus' victory over sin, death, and the devil.

*CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

There are times when sin reigns within us. Still, our heavenly Father is merciful, and He invites us to draw near to Him in repentance, asking for forgiveness.

- P Heavenly Father,
- We have ignored Your help in resisting Satan and His temptations. We have sinned against You in our thoughts, words, and actions. Yet our entire lives are lives of repentance. Have mercy on us. Forgive our sins, and lead us in righteousness, on account of Jesus. Amen.
- P Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son, Jesus Christ, to endure temptation, suffering, and death for us and our salvation. As a called and ordained servant of Christ and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the T Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen. We are forgiven. We are baptized into Christ.

SERMON HONEST REPENTANCE: LAW Genesis 1:1-10

*NICENE CREED


For those with small children, a nursery is available, located in the narthex, if you need a place to care for your child. Children's bulletins are in the narthex, or ask an usher.
