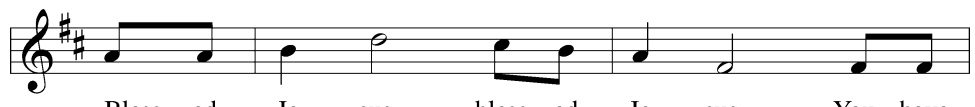

As a consequence,

1. The election of officers and board members is postponed until the September Voter's meeting.
2. Also, the council approved continuing the current budget with some adjustments until September. The adjustments include the reduction of our mortgage payment due to re-amortization, an increase in organist pay, an adjustment in preschool teacher and aide wages, a small increase in health insurance costs, and a line item for organ/piano maintenance.
