AS WE GATHER

In his first letter to the Corinthians, Paul emphasizes humility and the “foolishness” of the cross in addressing the wrangling among factions within the Corinthian church. By inspiration of the Holy Spirit, Paul finds the remedy to the factious pride not in “wisdom” or in “signs” but in drawing the Corinthians back to what gave them spiritual birth in the first place: the preaching of “Christ crucified.” We also are called to move from pride to repentant faith in the mercy of God in Christ Jesus.

P In the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. He who calls you is faithful; He will surely do it. Be at peace.

Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? ²¹For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to save those who believe. ²²For Jews demand

signs and Greeks seek wisdom,²³but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles,²⁴but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God.²⁵For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men.

²⁶For consider your calling, brothers: not many of you were wise according to worldly standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth.²⁷But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong;²⁸God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are,²⁹so that no human being might boast in the presence of God.³⁰He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, whom God made our wisdom and our righteousness and sanctification and redemption.³¹Therefore, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."
