

One is from Mount Sinai, bearing children for slavery; she is Hagar. ²⁵Now Hagar is Mount Sinai in Arabia; she corresponds to the present Jerusalem, for she is in slavery with her children. ²⁶But the Jerusalem above is free, and she is our mother. ²⁷For it is written,

"Rejoice, O barren one who does not bear;

break forth and cry aloud, you who are not in labor!

For the children of the desolate one will be more

than those of the one who has a husband."

²⁸Now you, brothers, like Isaac, are children of promise. ²⁹But just as at that time he who was born according to the flesh persecuted him who was born according to the Spirit, so also it is now. ³⁰But what does the Scripture say? "Cast out the slave woman and her son, for the son of the slave woman shall not inherit with the son of the free woman." ³¹So, brothers, we are not children of the slave but of the free woman.


The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven

→ everlasting. Amen.







In 2019, LCMS Youth Ministry published "7 Practices of Healthy Youth Ministry." One of the practices noted is "Serve and Lead." The resource noted, "Young people are watching the church and looking for the love of Christ to overflow to their neighbors" (p. 28). Blessed in the grace of the waters of Baptism, we are the Spirit's instruments to serve from childhood. Children in Lutheran schools are "Sent to Serve."
