

*INVOCATION AND CALL TO WORSHIP

P In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

ALL: Amen.

P Blessed are the poor in spirit—

Women: For theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

P Blessed are those who mourn—

Men: For they will be comforted.

P Blessed are the meek—

ALL: For they will inherit the earth.

P Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness—

Women: For they will be filled.

P Blessed are the merciful—

Men: For they will be shown mercy.

P Blessed are the pure in heart—

Women: For they will see God.

P Blessed are the peacemakers—

Men: For they will be called children of God.

P Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness—

ALL: For theirs is the kingdom of heaven!

*CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- P Blessed Jesus, empower me to receive salvation in your shed blood, your five wounds and your loving heart.
- C Though my sins rise to heaven—
- P Your merits soar above them.
- C Though unrighteousness weighs me down—
- P Your righteousness exalts me to your throne.
- C Though all things in me call for my rejection
- P All things in you plead for my acceptance.

ALL: Jesus, I am guilty, but in your blood and righteousness pardoned. I am lost, but in your power saved. I am wandering, but by your grace found. Give me perpetual broken-heartedness. Keep me always clinging to your cross.

P Jesus says in today's Old Testament lesson, "The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me to bring good news to the poor; he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound; to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor." (Isaiah 61:1–2) 2023 is still the year of the LORD's favor! In Christ you are forgiven and you are free!

ALL: Ours is the kingdom of God!


Winter Weather Closing


Welcome Guests
